The Pohorje Battalion, operating in Styria, is certainly one of these units. Knowledge of the methods and scale of Nazi violence in Styria is crucial to understanding the significance of the four months of activity of this unit. This extremely dark chapter of Slovenian history also includes the people from Slovenia who were transported to the most notorious Nazi concentration camp, Auschwitz: Slovenians, Jews and Roma.
